Watch the video on food chains. Then write a food chain with sea creatures or creatures that live by the sea. What is a predator? What is prey? Can you label predators and prey on your food chain.	Find out here about the living things that make their home in a rock pool. Why do they live there? When you’ve found out lots of facts, write an acrostic poem with some of the facts you’ve learned.
